#### WHAT IS BUNCO?

Bunco is a game played in teams with three dice. It is a social dice game involving no skill, only 100% luck. Bunco began in England in the 18th century. It was introduced to San Francisco as a gambling activity in 1855. Following the Civil War, Bunco became a popular parlor game. Bunco squads, law-enforcement groups, began raiding Bunco parlors during the 1920s and Prohibition to break up the gambling associated with Bunco. The game lost its popularity until the 1980s. It is currently estimated that nearly 27 million people in the USA play Bunco on a regular basis!

## Bob Van Zandt
