Tri-Lake Tree Give-A-Way

Charlie and Liz Brady's: 7680 50th Street N (corner Hilltop) on Saturday, April 27, 2013, starting at 8:30AM and continuing until the trees are gone.

After this year, Washington Conservation District will not be supplying any more trees. They have been selling low-cost tree seedlings to all of us Tri-Lakers and all other Washington County residents since 1975! Through the years our annual Tree Give Away has often been supplied by WeD, with the multi-purpose of educating us and supporting the health of our landscapes and wildlife. Today,



while tree planting remains vitally important to our neighborhoods and state, a recent change made in our state law will now be closing the nurseries of the MN Dept. of Natural Resources. (Who came up with this idea?) Although there will no longer be the ability to purchase their affordable trees after this year, WCD will continue to provide advice and some assistance to landowners. In honor of all the help WCD has provided in the past, this years Tree Give Away will supply a variety of selections to all currently paid Tri-Lakes members on a first comefirst serve basis. WCD's beautiful legacy will be visible in our Tri-Lakes community for generations to come when you plant:

- 1.) Serviceberry (see description)
- 2.) Prairie Fire Plum (new variety)
- 3.) smile. available Birch, for an additional \$5.00
- 1.) Serviceberry (Amelanchier canadensis) is a hardy, 4-season choice for our Tree Give Away. It is a draught tolerant, easy to grow, ornamental tree or large shrub, with dense white flowers in Spring that become tasty sweet, purple fruit attracting butterflies, birds and people who want to make jam or bake pies. These bright green or bluish leaves turn brilliant red and orange in Fall, adding more beautiful color to our landscape. In Winter, Serviceberry offers striking silvery bark. This plant is hardy in zones 2-9 and grows to approximately 20' tall, with 10'-20' width. Serviceberry is a fast grower in sun or shade, requires low maintenance, and can provide wind protection.

This year's event will be at Charlie and Liz Brady's: 7680 50th Street N (corner Hilltop) on Saturday, April 27, 2013, starting at 8:30AM and continuing until the trees are gone. It helps to ensure the trees get off to a good start if you plan your designated location for the plants and pre-dig holes. Come prepared to take away a bag of young trees and mulch. And come back to the Brady's in the evening(4f27/13) for continued socializing with your neighbors at the Diner's Club)
