Tri-Lakes Tree Give-A-Way

The Tree Giveaway 2013 welcomed in the first warm and sunny weekend of Spring this year, after an extenuated Minnesota winter. Approximately seventy Tri-Lakers came out to socialize and get their free Serviceberry (great for shade) and Prairie Red Fire Plum trees (tolerates partial shade) along with some Birches. This year Washington Conservation provided us with healthy plants with

labels so we all could take them home (and perhaps get them planted later when the shaded ground finally thaws!)

Master Gardener, Nancy Hansen, was on hand to describe best planting practices as well as tips for battling the infestation of ravenous Japanese beetles, and the ubiquitous (though harmless) Box Elder Bugs. The Buckthorn puller is still available for Tri-Lakers to borrow, to aid in ridding our neighborhood of the pernicious tree. Call 651.773.3171 if you want to facilitate taking out the bigger buckthorns with this tool. If you are pulling buckthorn, it helps to pull after a rain.

Thanks to the members of the Tri-Lakes Board who were present, as well as several helpful neighbors volunteering their time to prepare for the event. Thank you, Jan, Marcia and Charlie, Mary Ann and Ron!

The turn-out this year and last was significantly less than previous years when we used to provide trees for approximately 150 residents who would show up. Planting trees and shrubs in our neighborhood continues to be important to the health and beauty of our Tri-Lakes as well as a habitat for wildlife. Many older mature trees that are safety hazards need to be removed or replaced. However, dying trees can still provide "bed & breakfast" for the birds. Our landscapes are constantly changing. We will continue with the annual Tree Giveaway next year as always, but will adjust to the fewer numbers by purchasing fewer trees for next year.

The choice for next year's tree is yet to be determined. Any requests?




Tri-Lakes Improvement Association Proudly Presents... Water-ski Lessons & Ski Show Practice
