Water Testing Offered Again at the Annual Meeting

Members who come to our annual meeting on Monday February 7th at City Hall will be able to have their water tested for nitrates free of charge. We will also have water test kits from Washington County. Residents can take their own sample and drop it off at one of the county locations on Tuesday morning. These test kits are for nitrate and coliform bacteria. Washington County recommends well owners test their water yearly for both coliform bacteria and nitrates as a good housekeeping measure to ensure overall drinking water quality. The cost per testing a sample for both coliform bacteria and nitrate is \$43.00. Those who are interested in having the free nitrate test should arrive at 6:00 PM so this can be done before the annual meeting starts at 7:00 PM.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS TO COLLECT A SAMPLE:

1. Label a bottle or zip-lock type bag with your name or a number you can recognize.
2. Run you cold tap for about five minutes before collecting the sample.
3. Collect about ½ cup of water in the labeled bag or bottle. Be sure the container is soap free and clean.
4. Double bagging is recommended to reduce leakage.
5. Keep the sample in the refrigerator until the day of the annual meeting if you draw the sample early.
