NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM

2020 was a banner year for the Tri-Lakes Neighborhood Watch Program. Our “neighborhood” is rather large. So it’s a challenge to get a handle on everything that goes on. To address this, nine zones have been defined to manage the block captains more locally, and provide a local point of contact who is not more than a mile away. Furthermore, roles and responsibilities of block and zone captains have been defined and added to the website. (Check them out at tri-lakes.info/NW).

You may have seen the program signs, but what does “Neighborhood Watch” actually do? This program provides a central point of contact for the neighborhood when something of interest happens. This past year has seen lost dogs, a wandering black bear, some isolated car break-ins and more.



The neighborhood block captains serve as a resource to collate this information and provide facts (not rumors) for the community and a point of contact for law enforcement.

CERTIFIED SWIM LESSONS

Thank you to Laurie and John Hamerly for hosting the 2020 Swim Lessons on Lake Jane this year!

This tradition has been going on for decades and is a great way to teach kids how to swim (especially in a lake!). The lessons are led by Red Cross Certified instructors. This year, due to covid-19 mandates, the class numbers were lowered from 10 to 8 students per class. However, we still registered 54 swimmers. Altogether, there were seven different classes which lasted for two weeks. At only \$45 per swimmer this is one of the best values in the neighborhood.
